The General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) comes into force in May 2018 and represents a significant overhaul of data protection legislation; the accountability principle will mean that businesses will need to examine how they hold and use data and take steps to demonstrate compliance with the data protection principles

As businesses hold huge amounts of personal data relating to Customers, Vendors and Employees within their Dynamics NAV systems, currently there is very little functionality in existing or older versions to support GDPR

Our consultants have spent a considerable amount of time to study, decipher the GDPR legislation and develop a comprehensive toolset that can be plugged directly in to your Dynamics NAV application

The first steps towards GDPR compliance are understanding your obligations, what your current processes are and identifying any gaps. Undertaking a data protection audit is essential to achieving compliance

What the NAVGDPR toolset does

One of the key aims of the GDPR is to empower individuals and give them control over their personal data. The Regulation largely preserves the existing rights of individuals to access their own personal data and rectify inaccuracies

The NAVGDPR toolset enables your Dynamics NAV application to conform to the new regulations around Data Subject (Individual's) Rights:

- 🔒 Personal / sensitive data discovery
- 🔒 The right to be informed (Articles 12, 13, 14)
- 🔒 The right of access (Article 15)
- 🔒 The right to rectification (Article 16)
- 🔒 The right to erasure (Article 17)
- 🔒 The right to restrict processing (Articles 18, 19)
- 🔒 The right to data portability (Article 20)
- 🔒 Automated data encryption and destruction
- 🔒 All GDPR activities logged to a data processing register

Complying with GDPR will require knowing where all personal data exists within all databases across your IT landscape
This detailed assessment must be kept on hand and ready for regulatory inspection or compliance audits

Personal / sensitive data discovery

The GDPR applies to all personal data that is collected in the EU, regardless of where in the world it is processed. Any database containing personal or sensitive data collected within the EU will be in scope. Any organisation that has such

data in its systems, regardless of business size or sector, will have to comply with the GDPR

Personal data is anything that can identify a 'natural person' and can include information such as a name, address, date of birth, an email address (including work email address), phone number, bank details, posts on social networking websites, medical information or even an IP address

Finding and understanding your Company's personal data is the first step for compliance

Understanding all your customer's personal data elements and data lineage is the first necessary step to implement a compliant data governance process
